Introduction

This booklet serves as a guide for foreigners living in Dazaifu. It contains a summary of important information and administrative services, so that you can live safely, securely, and comfortably in our city. For more detailed information, please contact the specific organization listed within this guide. We kindly ask that if you choose to contact us, please speak Japanese or have someone who understands Japanese speak for you.

We sincerely hope that your day-to-day life in Dazaifu will be a very rewarding one.

About Dazaifu City

Dazaifu is located southeast of Fukuoka city. To the north is Mt. Shioji, and to the east is Mt. Homan. Running through the city is the Mikasa River, which originates in Mt. Homan and flows out to Hakata Bay. The average temperature is a relatively warm 16.5 degrees Celsius. Population is approximately 72,000. 10 million tourists come to the city to visit Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine, Ruins of Dazaifu Government Office and other attractions.

» Visa status

Please keep in mind that the conditions of your stay in Japan are dependent upon your visa status. Please check your passport, entry permission certificate, resident card, or certificate of alien registration card to see how long you are eligible to stay in Japan. If you wish to renew or change your visa status, you must first apply.

◆ Points regarding visa status

- Short stay visas, such as tourist visas, are not permitted for working in Japan. You will need to apply for permission to perform activities outside the scope of your visa.
- If you wish to renew your visa status, you can apply starting three months before it expires. As a rule, if you are on a short-term visa, you will not be able to renew your visa.
- If you are planning on leaving temporarily and then re-entering Japan, you will need to fill out the form for a re-entry permit.
- Performing activities not allowed by your visa, such as working without the proper visa, will be penalized. Also, you will be deported if your stay illegally exceeds the length of your visa.

My Number

Japanese Social Security and Tax Number system (“Individual Number” or “My Number”) was started in January 2016 for the fields of social security, tax and disaster response.

◆What is “My Number”?

“My Number” (Individual Number) is a 12-digit number assigned to individuals living in Japan under the Social Security and Tax Number System. It is used primarily in connection with social security, taxation, disaster response, and several other areas. Foreigners registered as residents in Japan (medium-term residents, special permanent residents, etc.) will also receive their Individual Number.

Households with a resident registration in Japan will have their “My Number” printed on the notification card sent by the city hall where they are registered as a resident, or on an Individual Number notice sent by the government.

※Individual Number notification will not be reissued.

◆When to use the “My Number” card

- For tax returns and other tax procedures
- For tax and social security procedures for your employer to use
- For tax procedures for brokerage firms and insurance companies to use.
- For receiving welfare benefits and for procedures under the National Health Insurance and Nursing Care Insurance programs.
- For sending or receiving money to or from other countries.

◆What is the “My Number” Card (Individual Number Card)?

- This card proves both your Individual Number and identity in any procedures related to the Individual Number. It also serves as your official ID card.
- You can apply for a “My Number” Card.
(The first issuance of the Card is free of charge)
- Even after receiving the “My Number” Card, you will still need to keep your residence card, special permanent resident certificate, etc.



◆Precautions in handling your Individual Number

- In case of a change of address or any change to the expiration date of your residential period, please contact the city hall.
- Do not carelessly tell your Individual Number to others, especially in suspicious telephone calls.

Administrative procedures at city hall

Basic resident register and personal seal

When you change your place of residence, first register it in the city, town, or village you lived in prior to moving. You should receive a change of address certificate. (You can also submit a moving-out notification via “Mynportal” using your “My Number” card.)

Then, within 14 days of moving into your new place of residence, please bring your Moving-out Certificate to the municipal office of the new place of residence and complete the moving-in procedures. When changing your place of residence, please be sure to bring your residence card or special permanent resident certificate.

As a rule, you must register your change of address in person, but an authorized representative may register for you.

◆ Requesting a basic resident register

On July 9th, 2012, the alien registration system was abolished. In its place, a new residency management system was started for foreigners and Japanese alike. Instead of a certification of information recorded on foreign residents (gaikokujin toroku genpyo kisai jiko shomeisho), foreign nationals will now receive a basic resident register (juminhyo).

Thus, if there are Japanese and foreign nationals in the same household, you can receive a certificate which shows information for all family members.

※If the above documents are not available, then a combination of two of the following are acceptable: health insurance card (kenko hokensho), eligibility verification form, pension book (nenkin techo), bankbook (yokin tsucho.) or hospital/clinic patient card (shinsatsu ken).

◆ Personal seal registrations

You can register only one seal per person. The seal must show the name or part of the name that appears on your basic resident register. Please check with the Citizen's Section before registering your seal.

Marriage, divorce, childbirth registration and report of death

In the Japanese system, foreigners are required to report marriages, divorces, childbirths and deaths.

If you need a certification of these notifications, request it from the city office you reported initially reported it to.



◆ Marriage registration

If you wish to get married in Japan, you will need the following documents. But the required documents may differ depending on your national origins and in case you married in overseas. Please contact the Citizen's Section for more information.

- 1) A sworn Affidavit of Competency to Marry (kon-in yoken gubi shomeisho).
A certificate to prove you have no spouse issued by your home government/local government or your country's embassy in Japan.
- 2) A document proving your nationality, such as a passport
- 3) Translations.
If documents (1) and (2) are prepared in a language other than Japanese, please attach a Japanese translation.
Please indicate the address of the translator at the end of the document and sign the document.
- 4) The signatures of two adult witnesses on the marriage registration.

◆ Divorce registration

Those who have a Japanese spouse and are currently residing in Japan can legally register for a divorce (rikon todoke).

◆ Childbirth registration

When a child is born in Japan, even if both parents (by marriage) are foreigners, a birth notification must be submitted to the Citizens Division within 14 days. If either parent (by marriage) is a Japanese citizen at the time of birth, the child will acquire Japanese citizenship. For more information on applying for status of residence for children, please contact the Fukuoka Immigration Bureau (Citizen's Division for special permanent residents).

◆ Report of death

When a foreign national dies in Japan, a notification of death must be submitted to the Citizen's Affairs Section within 7 days of the death by the notifier specified in the Family Registration Law. Please contact the Citizen's Affairs Division for the qualifications of the notifier.

》 Taxes

Japanese taxes (zeikin) include national taxes levied by the national government and local taxes levied by prefectural and municipal governments. National taxes include forest environment tax, income tax, corporate tax, inheritance tax, and consumption tax. Local taxes include prefectural taxes such as prefectural inhabitant tax and automobile tax, and municipal taxes such as municipal inhabitant tax, fixed asset tax, and light automobile tax.

◆Municipal, prefectural taxes, and forest environment taxes (including national income tax).

The municipal (shiminzei) and prefectural (kenminzei) inhabitant tax and forest environment tax are levied on those who live in Dazaifu City as of January 1 and had income during the previous year.

Even if you currently have no income, if you had income in the previous year, you will be taxed accordingly.

If the tax is deducted from your salary and paid by your company, it is due monthly from June to May of the following year; if paid by you, it is due in four installments in June, August, October, and January. Even those who have moved abroad will be taxed in Dazaifu City if they were residing there on January 1st of the same year.

The Forest Environment Tax is a new national tax that began in fiscal 2024, and is levied together with the municipal and prefectural taxes. In addition, like the municipal and prefectural taxes, an income tax (shotokuzei), a national tax, is imposed on your income for the year from January to December. You must file an income tax return even if you are away from Japan during that period. If income tax is collected from wages earned from part-time work, etc., you may be eligible for a refund on a portion of your income tax if you file a tax return at the tax office.

Income tax is self-assessed. Tax returns are filed between February 16 and March 15. (You do not have to file a personal income tax return if your only source of income is a salary from a regular employer or if your employer performs year-end adjustments.)

◆Fixed assets tax (property tax)

The fixed assets tax (kotei shisanzei) is imposed on those who own land, houses, and depreciable assets in Dazaifu City as of January 1 of that year.

The tax payments are made in four installments: April, July, September, and December.

◆Light vehicle tax

The light motor vehicle tax (environmental performance rate) is imposed on the acquisition of light motor vehicles with three or more wheels. The light motor vehicle tax (tax rate by type) is levied on those who own motorized bicycles, motorcycles, and light motor vehicles as of April 1 of each year. For vehicles with an engine displacement of 660 cc or more, the prefectural automobile tax is imposed.

▶▶ National Health Insurance (for those 74 or younger)

Those who live in Dazaifu and are not enrolled in their workplace medical insurance program, must enroll and pay the National Health Insurance program (kokumin kenko hoken). The goal of this program is to provide a worry-free system of receiving medical attention, and to lessen the financial burden of the medical bills on the patients.

Tourists, those staying on a three-month or less visa holders, diplomats and social insurance subscribers are ineligible for the national health insurance program.

◆ Admission procedure of the national health insurance program

In the following instances, please go through the National Health Insurance and Pension Section (City Hall).

1. When moving to Dazaifu City
2. When resigning from a company
3. When a child is born



◆ National Health Insurance program payment

The National Health Insurance tax is calculated for each household based on the previous year's income of those enrolled in the National Health Insurance program. If the insurance tax is not paid by the due date, a delinquency charge will be incurred, and the taxpayer may be subject to a disposition for delinquency. In addition, if you are in arrears for a long period of time, you may be required to pay a special medical care cost (10% of the total).

◆ Medical expense payments

When you visit a hospital for illness or injury, you can receive treatment by paying 30% or 20% of the treatment cost by presenting your insurance card (including your MYNA insurance card and certificate of eligibility) to the receptionist at the hospital. In addition, benefits are also provided in the event of childbirth or death.

※MYNA insurance card: My number card registered to be used as a health insurance card.

◆ Large sum medical expenses

If your monthly medical expenses become high due to illness or injury, you can show your insurance card (including My Number insurance card or eligibility certificate) and the "Certificate of Application of Maximum Amount" at the hospital reception. This will limit the amount you need to pay to the medical institution. Even if you receive treatment without presenting the "Certificate of Application of Maximum Amount" at the hospital reception desk, you may be reimbursed by the city for the difference between the maximum amount referred to above and the amount you paid, upon application. Therefore, please keep your receipts and do not discard them. Please note that the certain amount varies by household. For more details, please contact the National Health Insurance and Pension Division.

◆ Canceling your National Health Insurance

If any of the following apply, please complete the procedure to withdraw from National Health Insurance within 14 days and return your insurance card (including eligibility certificate and notification of eligibility information) to Dazaifu City Hall:

1. When you enroll in workplace health insurance (such as social insurance).
2. When you move out of Dazaifu City to another municipality.
3. When you leave the country.
4. In the event of death.

Long Life Medical Care System (For those 75 or older)

◆ Long Life Medical Care System

Those who live in Dazaifu who are 75 and above are essentially enrolled in the Long Life Medical Care System (koki koreisha iryo). The insurance premiums are paid by the city. The goal of this program is to provide a worry-free system of receiving medical attention, and to lessen the financial burden of the medical bills on the patients.

Public Pension System

◆About the Public Pension System

The Public Pension System is a social insurance system to support senior citizens, disabled people, and the families of deceased. All foreigners residing in Japan must enter the national pension system. Upon leaving Japan, you may be eligible for lump-sum withdrawal payments.

◆Eligibility for National Pension System

•All persons between the ages of 20 and 59 must enter the national pension system.
 ※If you work at a company, you must enter the employee's pension insurance system in addition to the national pension system.

◆When you need to register at the city office.




①When you Move-in
 ※Except company employees

②When you resign from a company
 Please submit the document to prove your resignation.
 ※When you get another job, you do not need to fill out the paperwork. Your company will do so.

③When returning to your home country.
 ※Except company employees

④If you have difficulty paying contributions of national pension.
 You can apply for the exemption/moratorium from contribution payments. Please consult at the pension counter at the city hall.
 If you are a student, please bring your student ID.

⑤English to receive the national pension.
 •You can receive the national pension at the age of 65 if you contributed more than 10 years of National pension/employee's pension insurance.
 •You may also receive the pension when you became disabled. Please consult with a staff at the National pension section, city hall.
 •In case of a death of breadwinner or pensioner, the family who was dependent on the deceased person might receive the national pension. Please consult with a staff at the National pension section, city hall.

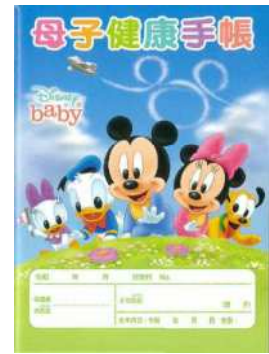

》 Pregnancy, childbirth and child-rearing

◆ Maternity record book

The Maternal and Child Health Handbook is an important record of the mother's health before and after childbirth, as well as the baby's development, health checkups, and vaccinations. It is issued at the Childcare Support Center. During issuance, we will explain various support systems, so please feel free to contact us.



◆ Premature child care system

There is a system in place that provides medical benefits for the care of premature infants if a doctor determines that hospitalization is necessary.

◆ Vaccinations

It is recommended that children receive vaccinations (yobo sesshu) against serious diseases. If the child is of a certain specified age, he or she may receive the vaccinations free of charge. The earliest vaccination period is when the child turns two months old. The vaccinations provide the child with a great deal of protection from infectious disease, and so they should be received on a systematic basis.

◆ Child Medical Expense Subsidy System.

We provide partial medical expense subsidies for children up to high school age. When receiving medical care, please present your insurance card (including My Number insurance card or eligibility certificate) and the child's medical certificate to the medical institution. To apply for the child's medical certificate, please bring the child's insurance card (including My Number insurance card or eligibility certificate). If the child's health insurance application is still being processed due to birth or other reasons, you can apply using the parents' insurance cards instead.

◆ Nursery school

Daycare centers provide care for children who cannot be looked after at home during the day due to their parents' work or illness. In the city, there are two public daycare centers, and 14 private daycare centers that care for preschool children.

◆ Kindergarten

Kindergarten is a school prescribed by the school education law. Children between the age of 3 and 5 years old can attend kindergarten.

There are five private kindergartens (yochien) in Dazaifu City.

※Kindergarten is not compulsory education in Japan.

Education

In Japanese education system, the elementary school is for six years, while junior high school and high school are for three years each, and university is for four years. The school year begins in April, and lasts until March of the following year. Education is compulsory through junior high school.

◆ Admission to elementary and junior high school

A child who turns six years old by April 1st is eligible to enter elementary school as a first grader for that year. Children of foreign nationality are welcome to be enrolled in, but not obligated to attend elementary and junior high school.

It is expected that children entering junior high school will have graduated from elementary school.

In the city's public schools, tuition and textbooks are provided free of charge. School lunch fees, school trip money, and school supply costs are the responsibility of the parents.

For admission into a private school, please inquire directly to the school. Please refer to Dazaifu City's major public facilities list on page 25 for more information on private schools.

◆ After-school program

After-school childcare centers provide a safe and healthy environment for elementary school children who would otherwise be home alone after school.

- **Operating Hours:** From after school until 5:00 PM.
 - During spring, summer, autumn, and winter breaks, as well as school holidays: from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM.
 - Extended care is available until 7:00 PM upon request.
 - On Saturdays: from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM, with extended care available until 6:00 PM upon request.
- **Closed Days:** Sundays, public holidays, August 13-15, and December 29 to January 3.

Waste disposal

◆ Designated garbage bag and collection times

Please place your garbage (gomi) in the city-designated garbage bags (senyou gomi bukuro). They are sold at such as supermarket and convenience store in Dazaifu City. Make sure you purchase designated garbage bag for Dazaifu City. Garbage bags are collected at night time. Please take out your garbage bags at the designated area from start of the evening to 10 pm on the set day for garbage collection.

◆ Classification of wastes

○ Burnable waste

- Burnable waste (moeru gomi) is collected twice a week. Please place your garbage in the **red-color** designated garbage bag. Make sure to remove any excess liquids before disposing.



○ Non-burnable waste (glass containers and bottles, tin cans and containers)

- Non-burnable waste (moenai gomi) is collected twice a month. Please wash the containers with water, and place them in the **green-color** designated garbage bag.
- Only empty food and beverage containers are accepted.




○ Non-burnable waste (not including glass containers and bottles, tin cans and containers)

- These non-burnable wastes are collected once a month. Please place them in the **transparent** designated garbage bag.
- Spray cans and portable gas range canisters should be empty before disposal, in order to release any excess gas.
- Knives, scissors, shavers, broken glass or pottery, and other dangerous objects should be wrapped in paper before disposal.
- Please place light bulbs, fluorescent bulbs and dry cells into the collection boxes at the city hall and community halls.



○ PET bottles, white food trays

- These are collected once a month. Please place the bottles and trays in the **yellow-color** designated garbage bag.
- Only beverage and food bottles with  mark, and white tray can be accepted.
- Remove the cap and label from the bottle, rinse with water, and dry.
- "White trays" are made of Styrofoam with an uncoated surface. Remove labels, stickers and food wrapping, then wash, dry, and pile them up without breaking them.



○ Large-size waste

- Collected once a month. Please make a booking on the phone 092-920-2156 at least 5 days before the appointed date of collection in your area for any days except Sat., Sun. and public holidays.
- Purchase a (orange-colored) sticker for large size waste disposal at a super market/convenience store in Dazaifu City then write the booking number on the sticker then place it on the item before taking it out.
- Waste that doesn't fit in a designated disposal bag must be disposed of as large-size waste.



○ Pruned trees and leaves

- When you dispose of pruned trees and leaves, please use the designated bag for burnable waste or borrow a specific bag.
- In case of using the specific bag, put a (**orange-colored**) sticker for large size waste disposal on a waste and call #092-924-0899 to make a reservation for waste pick-up.

○Electronic appliances, computers and mobile phones

These dates change from year to year, so please check with Environment Section, located within City Hall.

◆Notes

- Your garbage will not be accepted if: a designated Dazaifu City disposal bag is not used.
- It will also not be accepted if: your waste is not separated properly, it's not placed in the designated area, or placed on the scheduled date for that type of garbage.
- Those who live in an apartment, please place burnable and non-burnable wastes in their designated disposal areas.
- Up to 2 bags can be accepted per collection.

If you have a pet, you may be annoying your neighbors due to noises or smells it makes. Please take care of it responsibly while it is living with you.

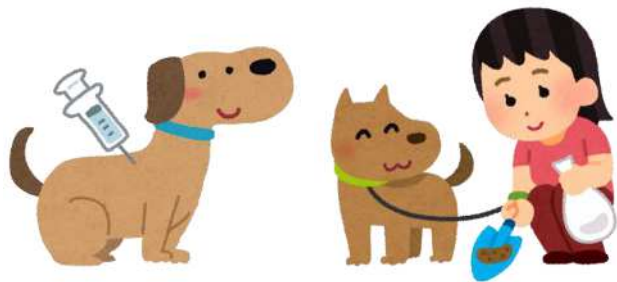
◆ Dog owner

- Holding a smartphone while riding or focusing on the screen while riding is subject to penalties.
- Wear a helmet when riding a bicycle.
- Park your bicycle in designated bicycle parking areas.
- Inconsiderate parking obstructs pedestrians and other vehicles, causing traffic accidents and congestion. Please park in the nearest bicycle parking area instead of thinking "it'll be just a moment."
- Bicycles left in no-parking zones will be removed, and storage fees will be charged when retrieving them.

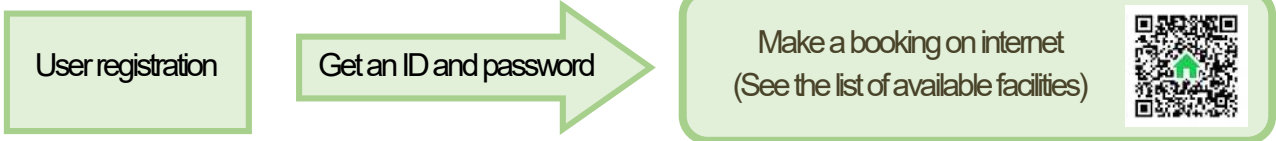

》 Incident (criminal), accident, fire, or other emergency

◆ If there is a criminal incident or traffic accident, dial 110

If a theft, criminal incident, injury related to a criminal incident, or traffic accident occurs, immediately dial 110 and report it.

When calling 110, please provide the following information:

1. Exactly what happened (criminal incident and accident)
2. When and where the incident occurred, and who was involved
3. Your name and phone number

Especially in the case of a traffic accident, no matter how small it may be, please either dial 110 or report it to the nearest police officer. Be sure to provide the names, phone numbers, and vehicle license plate numbers of those involved.

◆ If there is a fire, please dial 119

In case of a fire, immediately dial 119 to report it, and yell “Kaji da!” (Fire!) in a loud voice, in order to alert the people around you. If you can, get help from neighbors and try to put out the fire if an extinguisher is available. But if there is too much smoke, or if the fire reaches ceiling height, evacuate immediately. And finally, make it a habit to remember how to use a fire extinguisher.

When calling 119, please provide the following information:

1. Location of the fire
2. Your name and phone number
3. Any nearby landmarks which would aid in locating the fire
4. Severity of the fire

》 Natural disaster (typhoon and earthquake)

◆ Typhoon

In Japan, the highest number of typhoons typically occurs from July to October each year. Typhoons bring strong winds and heavy rain, which can cause flooding and damage to buildings if they pass nearby. To minimize damage, please take the following precautions:

1. Listen to weather information on the radio or TV.
2. If you are outside, try to return home quickly or take shelter indoors to avoid injury from flying debris. If you are at home, avoid going outside.
3. Before the wind becomes strong, bring potted plants and bicycles indoors or secure them.
4. Close shutters or storm doors to prevent windows from breaking due to flying debris.
5. If you live in low-lying areas near mountains, cliffs, or rivers, be prepared to evacuate at any time.
6. Prepare for power outages by having flashlights and radios ready.
7. Ensure you have enough drinking water and food.

◆ Earthquake

Japan experiences frequent earthquakes, and aftershocks can occur following a major quake. To minimize damage during an earthquake, please follow these precautions:

1. Protect yourself (e.g., take cover under a table) [Self-help].
2. Once the shaking stops, turn off any sources of fire.
3. Open doors to secure an exit (do not rush outside).
4. If there is a fire, alert others loudly and extinguish it quickly.
5. Avoid narrow alleys and block walls as they may collapse.
6. Do not walk near mountains or cliffs as they may crumble.
7. Evacuate to designated shelters on foot.
8. Cooperate with others for first aid [Mutual assistance].
9. Obtain accurate information from the radio or TV.

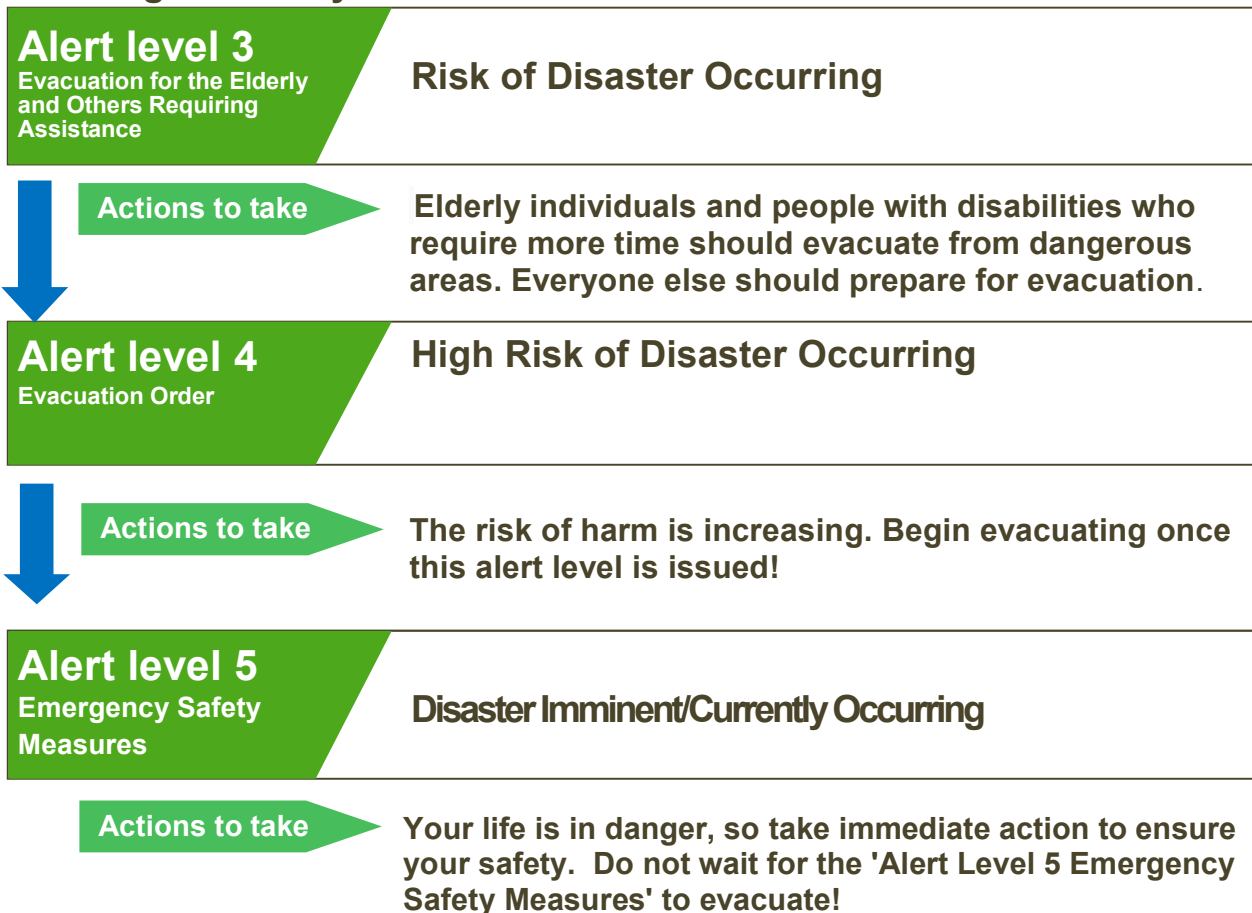

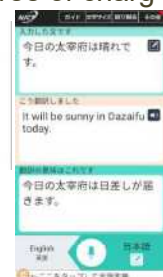
