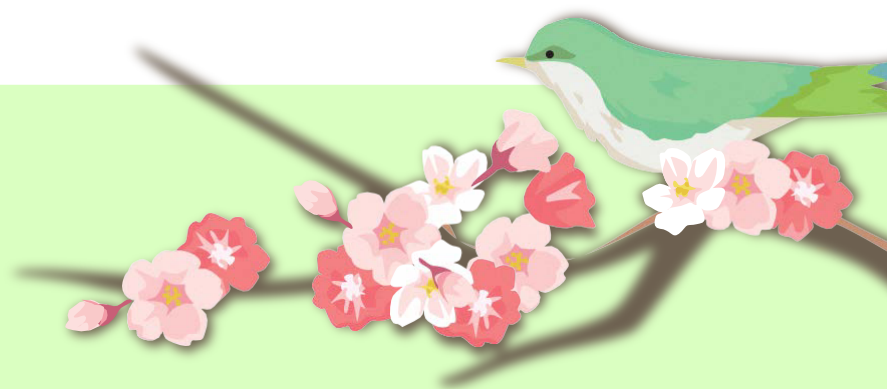

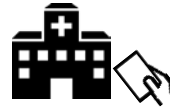

## Introduction

---

It contains a summary of important information and administrative services, so that you can live safely, securely, and comfortably in our city. We kindly ask that if you choose to contact us, please speak Japanese or have someone who understands Japanese speak for you.

We sincerely hope that your day-to-day life in Dazaifu will be a very rewarding one.

## About Dazaifu City

---

Dazaifu is located southeast of Fukuoka city. To the north is Mt. Shioji, and to the east is Mt. Homan. Running through the city is the Mikasa River, which originates in Mt. Homan and flows out to Hakata Bay. The average temperature is a relatively warm 16.5 degrees Celsius. Population is approximately 72,000. 10 million tourists come to the city to visit Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine, Ruins of Dazaifu Government Office and other attractions.

## » Visa status

Please keep in mind that the conditions of your stay in Japan are dependent upon your visa status. Please check your passport, entry permission certificate, resident card, or certificate of alien registration card to see how long you are eligible to stay in Japan. If you wish to renew or change your visa status, you must first apply.

### ◆ Points regarding visa status

- Short stay visas, such as tourist visas, are not permitted for work in Japan. You will need to apply for permission to perform activities outside the scope of your visa.
- If you wish to renew your visa status, you can apply starting three months before it expires. As a rule, if you are on an abbreviated-term visa, you will not be able to renew your visa.
- If you wish to leave temporarily and reentry to Japan, you will need to fill out the form for a re-entry permit.
- Performing activities not allowed by your visa, such as working without the proper visa, will be penalized. Also, you will be deported if your stay illegally exceeds the length of your visa.

For visa applications, changes to visa status, period of stay changes, permission to perform activities outside the scope of the current visa, permanent resident applications, and re-entry permits,

## My number

Japanese Social Security and Tax Number system (“Individual Number” or “My Number”) is started in January 2016 for the fields of social security, tax and disaster response.

### ◆What is the Individual Number?

Individual Number (“My Number”) is 12-digit numbers assigned to individuals living in Japan under the Social Security and Tax Number System. It is used in the fields of social security, tax and disaster response. Foreigners registered as residents in Japan (medium-term residents, special permanent residents, etc.) will also receive their Individual Number.

If you are registered as a resident in Japan, your Individual Number is printed on the notification card that you receive from the city hall of your registered address or Individual Number notification which you receive from Japanese government.

※Individual Number notification will not be reissued.

### ◆When to use the Individual Number

- For Tax return and tax procedures
- For tax and social security procedures to your employer for use
- For tax procedures to the securities firms and insurance companies to use.
- For receiving welfare benefits and for procedures under the National Health Insurance and Nursing Care Insurance programs.
- For sending or receiving money to or from other countries.

### ◆What is an Individual Number Card (My Number Card)?

- This card proves both your Individual Number and identity in any procedures related to the Individual Number. It also serves as your official ID card.
- You can apply for an Individual Number Card. (The first issuance of the Card is free of charge)
- Even after receiving the Individual Number Card, you will still need to keep your residence card, special permanent resident certificate, etc.



### ◆Precautions in handling the Individual Number

- In case of change address or any change of the expiration date of your residential period, please contact the municipal office.
- Do not carelessly tell your Individual Number to others, especially in suspicious telephone calls.

# Basic resident register and personal seal

## 1 Administration procedures at city hall

When you changed a place of residence, first register your change of address in the city, town or village you lived in before moving. You should receive a change of address certificate.

Next bring the certificate to City Hall within 14 days of moving. Be sure to bring your resident card or special certificate of permanent residence.

As a rule, you must register your change of address in person, but a representative with proper authority may register for you.

### ◆ Requesting a basic resident register

On July 9th, 2012, the alien registration system was abolished. In its place, a new residency management system was started for foreigners and Japanese alike. Instead of a certification of information recorded on foreign residents (gaikokujin toroku genpyo kisai jiko shomeisho), foreign nationals will now receive a basic resident register (juminhyo).

Thus, if there are Japanese and foreign nationals in the same household, you can receive a certificate which shows information for all family members.

※If the above documents are not available, then a combination of two of the following are acceptable: health insurance card (kenko hokensho), pension book (nenkin techo), bankbook (yokin ts ucho.) or hospital/clinic patient card (shinsatsu ken).

### ◆ Personal seal registrations

You can register only one seal per person. The seal must show a name or part a name which appears on your basic resident register. Please check with the Citizen's Section before registering your seal.

## 》 Marriage, divorce, childbirth registration and report of death

In the Japanese system, foreigners are required to report the marriage, divorce, childbirth and death.

If you need a certification of these notification, request it to the municipality office you reported.



### ◆ Marriage registration

If you wish to get married in Japan, you will need the following documents. But the required documents may differ depending on your national origins and in case you married in overseas. Please contact the Citizen's Section for more information.

- 1) A sworn Affidavit of Competency to Marry (kon-in yoken gubi shomeisho).  
A certificate to prove you have no spouse issued by your home government/local government or your country's embassy in Japan.
- 2) A document can prove your nationality such as passport
- 3) Translations. If the documents for 1) and/or 2) are not Japanese, please attach a Japanese translation to them. Include the translator's name address and seal at the end of the translation.
- 4) The signatures and seals of two adult witnesses on the marriage registration.
- 5) Personal seal. For people from countries that do not customarily use personal seals, a signature is acceptable.

### ◆ Divorce registration

Those who have a Japanese spouse and are currently residing in Japan can legally register for a divorce (rikon todoke).

### ◆ Childbirth registration

Please register at the Citizen's Services Section within 14 days of the birth of your child (shusseidoke). If one of the parents is Japanese, the child can acquire Japanese citizen-ship. For more information of child's Japanese citizen-ship, please contact Fukuoka Regional Immigration Bureau.

### ◆ Report of death

Please file a report at the Citizen's Services Section within 7 days of someone's death (shibotodoke). For more information of, please contact Citizen's Services Section.

## 》 Taxes

Taxes (zeikin) are divided into two categories: national taxes and local taxes. National taxes include income tax, corporate tax, inheritance tax, and sales tax. There are two kinds of local taxes. One is the prefectural level tax, which includes prefectural resident tax and vehicle tax. Another is the city, or municipal tax-level, which includes municipal tax, fixed assets tax and light vehicle tax.

### ◆Municipal tax and prefectural resident tax and income tax(national tax).

If you reside in Dazaifu on January 1st of the current year, the city will assess municipal (shiminzei) and prefectural (kenminzei) resident taxes, based on your salary from the previous year. Even if you currently have no income, you will still be assessed these taxes.

If the resident taxes are deducted from the salary, your employer will make the payments each month from June to May the next year. If those taxes are paid by individuals, the payment are made on June, August, October and January.

Even if you transferred to overseas, you reside in Dazaifu on January 1st that year, you are assessed the resident taxes.

As same as the resident taxes, "Income tax (shotokuzei)"the national tax is imposed on income earned in a one-year period from January to December. Even if you leave Japan for a period of time, you are required to file taxes. In case the income tax is collected from wages such as part-time jobs, if you file an income tax return at the tax office, some income tax may be subject to refund.

Income taxes are the responsibility of the individual. The filing period is from February 16th through March 15th. But if the source of your earnings are from a sole employer, who withholds taxes on your behalf and conducts a year-end withholding adjustment, then you do not need to file a tax return. (cannot declare an income tax return at city hall)

### ◆Fixed assets tax (property tax)

If you own depreciable land, real estate, or depreciable assets in Dazaifu as of January 1st, you will be assessed fixed assets tax (kotei shisanzei).

The tax payments are made in four installments: April, July, September, and December.

### ◆Light vehicle tax

Light vehicle tax (environmental performance discount) is a tax to be subjected to taxation when you purchase light vehicle more than tricar. Those who own a motorized bike, motorcycle or light vehicle as of April 1st will be imposed Light vehicle tax (type discount) every year. Over 660cc vehicle are subject to regular vehicle tax (a prefectural tax).

## 》 National Health Insurance (for those 74 or younger)

Those who live in Dazaifu and are not enrolled in their workplace medical insurance program must enroll and pay into the National Health Insurance program (kokumin kenko hoken). The goal of this program is to provide a worry-free system of receiving medical attention, and to lessen the financial burden of the medical bills on the patients.

Tourists, those staying on a three-month or less visa holders, diplomats and social insurance subscribers are ineligible for the national health insurance program.

### ◆ Admission procedure of the national health insurance program

In the following instances, please go through the National Health Insurance and Pension Section (City Hall).

1. Moving to Dazaifu City
2. Resigning the company
3. A child was born



### ◆ National Health Insurance program payment

The amount of the premium for each household is based on subscriber's previous year income. If you are unable to pay the tax by due date, you may be charged late fee or be subject to a process for the recovery of unpaid premiums. Non-payment over a long period of time will result in the inability to renew your insurance card, receive no benefits with qualification (full-fare).

### ◆ Medical expense payments

When you visit the hospital and present your insurance card, you will be responsible for paying a 30 % or 20% co-payment for the medical expenses. And there are delivery and death benefits.

### ◆ Large sum medical expenses

In the case where in one month you pay large sum for medical bills, there is a way to reduce the amount you must pay for medical costs. You must present a High-Cost Medical Expense Benefit (gendogaku tekio ninteisho), along with your medical insurance card when you first visit the hospital, to be eligible for this service. If you fail to present High-Cost Medical Expense Benefit, you will first have to pay the full amount of the medical costs. But afterwards, you can apply for repayment. You will need to show any receipts from the medical facility, so be sure to keep them.

### ◆ Canceling your National Health Insurance

Under the following instances. National Health Insurance should be canceled within 14 days. The medical insurance card must be returned to City Hall as well.

- 1) Joining a company's health insurance program
- 2) Leaving Dazaifu City
- 3) Returning to your home country
- 4) Upon death

## » Long Life Medical Care System (For those 75 or older)

### ◆ Long Life Medical Care System

Those who live in Dazaifu who are 75 and above are essentially enrolled in the Long Life Medical Care System (koki koreisha iryo). The insurance premiums are paid by the city. The goal of this program is to provide a worry-free system of receiving medical attention, and to lessen the financial burden (10% or 30%) of the medical bills on the patients.

## » Health Promotion and Health Examination

### ◆ Specific and General health examination

Those who are enrolled in National Health Insurance and between ages 40 and 74, are eligible for specific health examination. General health examination is for between ages 20 and 39 and reliefer households.

# Public Pension System

## ◆About the Public Pension System

The Public Pension System is a social insurance system to support senior citizens, disabled people, and the families of deceased. All foreigners residing in Japan must enter the national pension system. Upon leaving Japan, lump-sum withdrawal payments may apply.

## ◆Eligibility for National Pension System

•All persons between the ages of 20 and 59 must enter the national pension system.  
 ※If you work at a company, you must enter the employee's pension insurance system in addition to the national pension system.

### ◆When you need to register at the city office.




①When you Move-in  
 ※Except company employee

②When you retired from company  
 Please submit the document to prove your retirement.  
 ※When you get a job, there is no need for you to carry out the procedures yourself. Your company will do it

③When returning to your home country.  
 ※Except company employee

④If you have difficulty paying contributions of national pension.  
 You can apply for the exemption/moratorium from contribution payments. Please consult at the pension counter at the city hall.  
 If you are a student, please bring your student ID.

⑤English to receive the national pension.  
 •You can receive the national pension at the age of 65 if you contributed more than 10 years of National pension/employee's pension insurance.  
 •You may also receive the pension when you became disabled. Please consult with a staff at the National pension section, city hall.  
 •In case of a death of breadwinner or pensioner, family who was dependent on the deceased person might receive the national pension. Please consult with a staff at the National pension section, city hall .

## 》 Pregnancy, childbirth and child-rearing

### ◆ Maternity record book

The maternity record book (boshi kenko techo) is used to track the health of the mother both before and after childbirth. It's also an important record of the newborn's physical growth, health examinations, and vaccinations. ### ◆ Premature child care system

This child care system offers health benefits to premature babies who are hospitalizing with doctor's order.

### ◆ Vaccinations

It is recommended that children receive vaccinations (yobo sesshu) against serious diseases. If the child is of a certain specified age, he or she may receive the vaccinations free of charge. The earliest vaccination period is when the child turns two months old. The vaccinations provide the child with a great deal of protection from infectious disease, and so they should be received on a systematic basis.

### ◆ Children's medical expenses issue system.

When a child up to junior high school 3rd grade visits the hospital, part of the medical bill is subsidized. A child health insurance card must be presented at the time of the visit.

### ◆ Nursery school

Parents who work, have an illness, or otherwise unable to care for their pre-school aged children during the daytime, can enroll them in a nursery school (hoikusho). Dazaifu has 2 public and 12 private nursery schools. Children who are not of school age can attend one of them.

### ◆ Kindergarten

Kindergarten is a school prescribed by the school education law. Age 3 to 5 years old children go to the kindergarten.

There are five private kindergartens (yochien) in Dazaifu City.

※Kindergarten is not compulsory education in Japan.

## ◆Child-care allowance

The child-care allowance (jido te-ate) is a provision made to parents to aid in their child's upbringing. The allowance is available to those with a home address in Japan, and with children who have not yet graduated from junior high school.

## Education

In Japanese education system, the elementary school is for six years, while junior high school and high school are for three years each, and university is for four years. The school year begins in April, and lasts until March of the following year. Education is compulsory through junior high school.

### ◆ Admission to elementary and junior high school

A child who turns six years old by April 1st is eligible to enter elementary school as a first grader for that year. Children of foreign nationality are welcome to be enrolled in, but not obligated to attend elementary and junior high school.

It is expected that children entering junior high school have graduated from elementary school.

In the city's public schools, tuition and textbooks are provided free of charge. School lunch fees, school trip money, and school supply costs are the responsibility of the parents.

For admission into a private school, please inquire directly to the school. Please refer to Dazaifu city's major public facilities list on page 25 for more information on private schools.

### ◆ After-school program

Parents who are unable to care for elementary students after school can enroll them in the after-school program (gakudo hoikusho). Children who are in the 1st through 3rd grade of elementary school are eligible.

- Hours End of school day until 5 p.m.  
Those who wish can extend their child's stay until 7 p.m.
- Saturday hours are 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.  
Those who wish can extend their child's stay until 6 p.m.  
Summer, winter and spring vacation, and school compensatory holiday hours are 8 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- Closed Sundays, National holidays, August 13 to 15. December 29 to January 3.

# Waste disposal

## ◆ Designated garbage bag and collection times

Please place your garbage (gomi) in the city-Designated garbage bag (senyou gomi bukuro). They are sold at such as supermarket and convenience store in dazaifu city. Make sure you purchase designated garbage bag for Dazaifu City. Garbage bags are collected at night time. Please take out your garbage bags at the disignated area between the evening and before 10 pm on the appointed date.

## ◆ Classification of wastes

### ○ Burnable waste

- Burnable waste (moeru gomi) is collected twice a week. Please place your garbage in the **red-color** designated garbage bag. Make sure to remove any excess liquids before disposing.



### ○ Non-burnable waste (glass containers and bottles, tin cans and containers)

- Non-burnable waste (moenai gomi) is collected twice a month. Please wash the containers with water, and place them in the **green-color** designated garbage bag.
- Only empty food and beverage containers are accepted.




### ○ Non-burnable waste (not including glass containers and bottles, tin cans and containers)

- These non-burnable wastes are collected once a month. Please place them in the **transparent** designated garbage bag.
- Spray cans and portable gas range canisters should be empty before disposal, in order to release any excess gas.
- Knives, scissors, shavers, broken glass or pottery, and other dangerous objects should be wrapped in paper before disposal.
- Please place light bulbs, fluorescent bulbs and dry cells into the boxes at the city hall and community halls.



### ○ Pet bottles, white food trays

- These are collected once a month. Please place the bottles and trays in the **yellow-color** designated garbage bag.
- Only beverage and food bottles with  mark, and white-tray can be accepted.
- Remove the cap and label from the bottle, rinse with water, and dry.
- "White tray" is made of styrofoam with uncoated surface. Remove levels, stickers and food wrap, then wash, dry, and pile up without breaking it.



### ○ Large-size waste

- Collected once a month. Please make a booking on the phone 092-920-2156 at least 5 days before the appointed date of collection in your area except Sat., Sun. and public holidays.
- Purchase a (orange -colored) sticker for large size waste disposal at super markets/convenience stores in Dazaifu city and write a booking number on the sticker then place it on the item before take it out.
- Waste that doesn't fit in a designated disposal bag must be disposed of as large-size waste.

### ○ Pruned trees and leaves

- When you dispose pruned tree and leaves, please use designated bag for burnable waste or borrow specific bag.
- In case of using the specific bag, put a (**orange-colored**) sticker for large size waste disposal on a waste and call #092-924-0899 to make a reservation for waste pick-up.



## ○Electronic appliances, computers and mobile phones

- TV's, washing machines, clothes dryers, air conditioners, refrigerators and freezers cannot be collected. Please have the appliance picked up by the store you bought it at. There is a fee for this service.
- If you don't know where you purchased the item, please ask near by electrical shop.

- To dispose mobile phone, please use recycling box located near you.  
(Recycling box locate on city hall #1 floor, Iki-iki joho center #2 floor, Plum Karukoa Dazaifu #2 floor and Tobiume arena #1 floor.)

## ◆Designated waste disposal areas

### ○Burnable waste, large-size waste

In front of your house or within the designated area of your apartment or condominium.

### ○Non-burnable waste, pet bottles, white food trays

In your neighborhood's designated area or your apartment or condominium.

※If you don't know where to place the bags, please ask a neighbor.

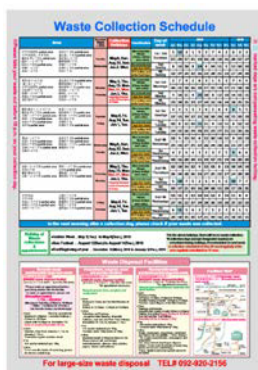

## 》 Rules for keeping animals (pets)

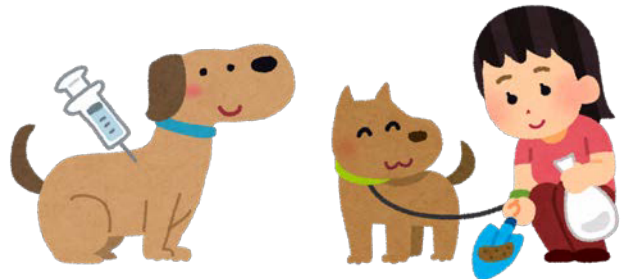
If you have a pet, you may be annoying your neighbors due to its screams or smells. Please keep it responsibly until it dies.

### ◆ Dog owner

○ Domestic dogs are required to register once in a life-time and get a rabies vaccination once a year. Please apply at Environment Section of Dazaifu City Hall.

○ When you walk your dog, please follow the rules below.

- Please walk your dog on a leash.
- Please remove any feces left by your dog and carry it home.
- Please wash away your pets' urine with a bottle of water.



### ◆ Cat owner

○ Please spay or neuter your cat.

○ Please always keep your cat in the house and don't let it go outside.



### ◆ About feeding stray cats

○ Please don't feed stray cats, because your neighbors can be annoyed by its feces.

### ◆ Other pets owner

○ Please don't throw away pets that you can't keep anymore, and prevent them from escaping.

### ◆ Noise

- Please show good manners by keeping noise levels down, especially during the early morning or late evening hours.



### ◆ Public places

- When you visit public places or buildings, please remember to obey their rules.
- Be sure to take your own waste with you after you are done.

### ◆ Disposing of waste

- Never discard cigarette butts, gums, empty cans, or trash on the road or into river.
- If you smoke, please carry a portable ash tray with you.



### ◆ Bicycles

※As of October 1, 2020 it is mandatory to enter the cycle insurance. You must enter the insurance.

- Bicycles are to be ridden on the left side of the street, sharing the road with vehicles.
- Carrying a passenger, using a mobile phone, and riding while intoxicated are against the law.
- When you ride a bicycle, do not run alongside of other bicycle.
- Park your bike in a designated bicycle parking area.
- Leaving your bike in the wrong spot, even for a short while, can cause inconvenience for pedestrians and other bicyclists. It can also be the cause of a traffic jam or even worse, an accident.
- Bicycles in a no-parking zone will be left removed. A storage fee will be charged for the bicycle's retrieval.



Free bicycle parking areas in and around Dazaifu

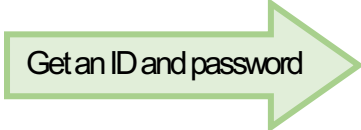

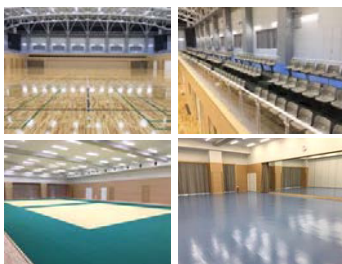

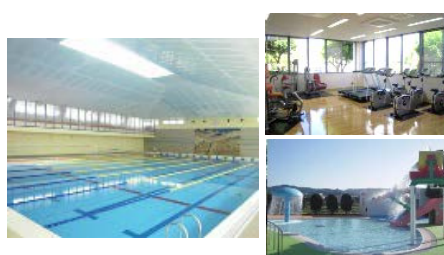

### ◆Gas

### ◆Bank account

Payment of public utility charges, money deposits, and transfers can be automatically withdrawn by establishing a bank account (ginko koza). To open an account, you will need Residence card.

## In case of emergency

## Incident (criminal), accident, fire, or other emergency

### ◆ If there is a criminal incident or traffic accident, dial 110

If a theft, criminal incident, injury related to a criminal incident, or traffic accident occurs, immediately dial 110 and report it.

When you call, be sure to report the following:

1. Exactly what happened (criminal incident and accident)
2. When and where the incident occurred, and who was involved
3. Your name and phone number

Especially in the case of a traffic accident, no matter how small it may be, please either dial 110 or report it to the nearest police officer. Be sure to provide the names, phone numbers, and vehicle license plate numbers of those involved.

### ◆ If there is a fire, please dial 119

In case of a fire, immediately dial 119 to report it, and yell “Kaji da!” (Fire!) in a loud voice, in order to alert the people around you. If you can, get help from neighbors and try to put out the fire if an extinguisher is available. But if there is too much smoke, or if the fire reaches ceiling height, evacuate immediately. And finally, make it a habit to remember how to use a fire extinguisher.

When you call, be sure to report the following:

1. Location of the fire
2. Your name and phone number
3. Any nearby landmarks which would aid in locating the fire
4. Severity of the fire

## 》 Natural disaster (typhoon and earthquake)

### ◆ Typhoon

In Japan, typhoon season usually lasts from July through October. In a typhoon, heavy wind and rain can cause flooding and structures to collapse. In order to lessen the danger posed by typhoons, please take the following precautions:

1. Keep informed of the current situation via radio or TV.
2. Evacuate indoors. Refrain from going outside-- the high winds of a typhoon can cause objects to fly through the air, potentially causing harm.
3. Move potted plants and bicycles to inside the house or fix them before the typhoon arrives.
4. Close the storm shutters to protect windows from flying objects caused by strong winds.
5. Get prepared to evacuate if you are on a mountain, a slope, or a lower ground such as near a river.
6. Have a flashlight and portable radio ready in case of a power outage.
7. Keep an adequate amount of emergency food and water on hand.

### ◆ Earthquake

Japan is a country that experiences many earthquakes. After a big earthquake, aftershocks may occur afterwards. In order to lessen the danger posed by earthquakes, take the following precautions:

1. Protect yourself from falling objects during the shaking (ex. getting under a table).
2. Turn off any fires after the tremors of the earthquake stops.
3. Keep entrance doors open as a means of escape.  
Don't escape in a panic.
4. If a fire breaks out, let people know first then extinguish it immediately.
5. Because of the risk of falling objects, avoid narrow streets and concrete-block walls.
6. Mountain and cliffs pose landslide dangers.  
Avoid walking near them.
7. Evacuate to the evacuation site by foot.
8. Work with others to provide aid and relief.
9. Get accurate information from the radio or TV.



Make it a habit to remember your designated evacuation area, as well as the evacuation route.

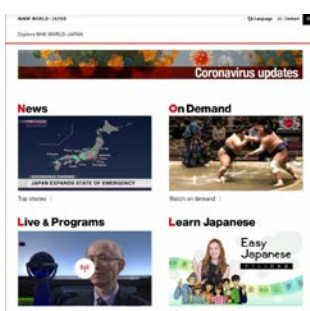

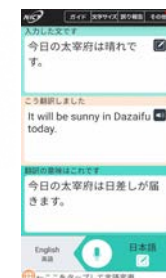
